### Lady Lions Earn First-Ever NCAA Post-Season Appearance

The Piedmont College women's basketball team earned its first-ever NCAA Division-III Tournament invitation in dramatic fashion as the Lady Lions downed rival Maryville College 60-59 in the Great South Athletic Conference Tournament Championship in LaGrange, GA. Nikki Sosebee hit one of two free throws with one second remaining to stamp the Lady Lions' first-ever NCAA post-season appearance. In a see-saw game that featured 18 lead changes and 11 ties, second-seeded Maryville led by a game-high six points with nine minutes remaining in the second half. After the Scots went up by two points junior Sheena Trimiar recorded the game-tying shot on a tip-in with 20 seconds remaining in the game. Maryville took the game's final shot from the field with less than two seconds remaining. Sosebee was fouled after the defensive rebound and proceeded to hit the first of two free-throws, sealing the one-point victory and the conference championship. Beth Adcock led three Lady Lions in double-figures with 16 points and a team-high four assists and for her efforts was voted the tournament's Most Valuable Player. Lisa Jennings and Yetta Bailey notched 10 points apiece while Sosebee recorded six points and a game-high nine rebounds.

### About The Competition

R-MC currently stands at 24-4 overall on the season. The Jackets captured their fourth league championship in five years with a 76-65 win over Virginia Wesleyan College on Sunday. R-MC was paced by tournament MVP Salem Shaffer who averaged 17 points in three games over the weekend.

Rounding out the four-team regional at Randolph-Macon will be William Paterson University (22-5) from the New Jersey Athletic Conference and McDaniel College (23-3) from the Centennial Conference. Both teams earned Pool C bids.

William Paterson (22-5), the South Division champions in the New Jersey Athletic Conference, earned a second of the 20 at-large bids after falling to Kean in the conference championship 62-59 on Saturday.

McDaniel (23-3) earned its first-ever at-large bid into the NCAA tournament after falling to eventual Centennial Conference-champion Ursinus in the conference tournament semifinals. The Green Terror strung together a program-record 19 consecutive victories before the Saturday's 63-53 loss.

## Head Coach Jamie Childs

Entering her second season leading the Piedmont College women's basketball coaching staff is head coach Jamie Childs. Childs was promoted to the top position on July 12th, 2005. The Piedmont College alum returns to her alma mater from Middle Georgia College where she has served as the head women's basketball coach for the past two seasons. In her first season at Piedmont, Childs led the Lady Lions to a 20-7 overall record and 11-3 conference mark. In two seasons at Middle Georgia, Childs recorded a career record of 31-21 (.596) and led her 2004-2005 squad to the Georgia Junior College Athletic Association championship game. Childs was the assistant women's basketball Coach at Abraham Baldwin Agricultural College (ABAC) after beginning her coaching career at Statesboro High School for two years while attending Georgia Southern University. Childs received her Master's of Science in Kinesiology with an emphasis in Sport Psychology from Georgia Southern University and her bachelor's degree in Psychology from here at Piedmont College. While at Piedmont, Childs lettered in basketball for four years under former head coach Charles Cooper and softball for two years under current head coach Terry Martin. Childs attended Statesboro High School in Statesboro, GA where she was part of the basketball, softball, cross country, and track teams throughout her high school career.

## Piedmont Challenges Itself With National-Caliber Schedule

The 2006-07 schedule featured 21 of the 23 games against NCAA Division-III South Region opponents. The schedule was highlighted by a season-opening trip to the suburbs of Boston, MA for the Amherst College Tip-Off Classic. After the Tip-Off Classic the Lady Lions played 21 consecutive South-Region games.

## Lady Lions Ranked In Latest NCAA National Statistics

PC is currently ranked in the top-50 of the latest NCAA Division-III national statistics in four categories. The Lady Lions are seventh in blocked shots per game (6.1), 23rd in assists per game (16.5), 45th in field-goal percentage (42.9) and 50th in scoring offense per game (70.3).

## Piedmont College Making Fourth NCAA Post-Season Appearance

The NCAA post-season appearance is the first-ever for the PC women's basketball team as this year marked the first-ever automatic berth granted to the conference tournament champion. The NCAA selection is the fourth since Piedmont became full-fledged NCAA members four seasons ago as the men's soccer (2003), men's tennis (2004), and softball (2006) teams have each earned post-season participation.

## PC Youth Movement

The Piedmont College women's basketball roster features no seniors, seven juniors, three sophomores, and four freshman. The junior class has carried the Lady Lions as the seven players have accounted for 58% of the scoring offense for the season. The junior class is led by Nikki Sosebee, named to the 2006-07 Great South All-Conference Team, who is the current team leader in points per game (11.6), rebounds per game (8.1), free-throw percentage (79%), and field-goals made (101). Sheena Trimmar is leading the team in steals (73) and field-goal percentage (55%). Yetta Bailey, also named to the Great South All-Conference Team, is leading PC in blocks (41) and is third on the team in points per game (9.9). The sophomore class is led by Beth Adcock, the Great South Athletic Conference Tournament Most Valuable Player and All-Conference member, who is leading the Lady Lions assists per game (5.5) and is second on the team in points per game (11.5). Sophomore Kayla Duncan, the reigning Great South Athletic Conference Freshman of the Year, is second on the team in blocks (40) and field-goal percentage (54%). The freshman class is highlighted by Lisa Jennings, named to the Great South Athletic Conference All-Freshman Team, who is currently leading the Lady Lions in three-pointers (34).
