

About Piedmont College

The oldest co-educational four-year, liberal arts college in northeast Georgia, Piedmont College (est. 1897) provides an excellent education in a small-town environment. Located on a 100-acre campus in the foothills of the Blue Ridge Mountains, PC is a small college with approximately 2,000 students and a student-to-faculty ratio of less than 14 to one. The college offers bachelor of arts and bachelor of science degrees in 26 major areas. Piedmont also offers numerous minors and has pre-professional programs in six fields of study from law to medicine. Despite being a small private institution, Piedmont College is growing by leaps and bounds. Just in the past five years, over \$25 million dollars of new buildings have been erected on the beautiful campus.



Intercollegiate Athletics

Piedmont College participates in 13 intercollegiate sports including seven for women and six for men. PC fields squads in men's and women's cross country, men's and women's soccer, and volleyball in the fall season. The winter season is made up of men's and women's basketball while the spring sports are baseball, softball, men's and women's golf, and men's and women's tennis. Since the fall of 2003 Piedmont has been an active member of NCAA Division-III with additional affiliations in the Great South Athletic Conference and the National Christian College Athletic Association.

NCAA Division-III

Great South Athletic Conference

The Great South Athletic Conference was founded in 1999 as a group of NCAA Division-III member institutions from the southeast with similar academic and athletic interests. Charter members include Fisk University, LaGrange College, Maryville College, and Piedmont College. In 2002, Huntingdon College and women's colleges Agnes Scott College and Wesleyan College were granted membership. In 2003, Spelman College was admitted to the GSAC on a provisional basis. The schools spread across Alabama, Georgia, and Tennessee. All seven schools are either active or provisional members of the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA) Division-III.

Johnny Mize Athletic Center



The home of the Piedmont College Department of Intercollegiate Athletics is the Johnny Mize Athletic Center. Opened in the spring of 2000, the 4.4 million dollar facility is one of the premier collegiate arenas for Division-III. The facility which is named after former Demorest resident and 1981 Baseball Hall of Fame inductee Johnny Mize, houses the Johnny Mize Baseball Museum. In addition to the baseball museum, the facility includes the 1,200 seat Cave Arena, a state-of-the-art two-story fitness center, four locker rooms, the athletic training and rehabilitation facility, two classrooms, an indoor track, a conference room, and offices for the PC Athletics staff.

Piedmont College Tennis Complex

The Piedmont College men and women's tennis programs call the tennis courts at Walker Complex their home. Located at the top of Walker Complex, the courts provide a breathtaking view of both the campus and the surrounding mountain ranges. After being recently repaved, the tennis courts provide a tremendous playing surface for all participants. These fully lighted courts provide one of the best tennis facilities in the entire South. With bleacher seating and a fenced in area the facility is very conducive for all spectators.

2006 Season Preview

The 2006 Piedmont College women's tennis team will look to improve their 13-7 overall record of 2005. The Lady Lions went a perfect 7-0 in Great South Athletic Conference play and tallied their second GSAC tournament championship in as many years.

The Lady Lions return six letterwinners from last season's squad after PC lost Aline Quintal and Laurie Campbell to graduation. PC is anchored by five seniors: Mandy Brittain, Emily Conner, Jennifer Hewitt, Lindsey Hughes and Jennifer Mulligan. Returning for their junior seasons are Marlene Morris and Mindy Pfeiffer.

Former player and graduated senior Quintal was named the Great South Athletic Conference Player of the Year last season. She was joined on the All-Conference team by Mulligan and Pfeiffer who competed in #5 and #6 singles respectively.

The doubles teams of Quintal/Hughes and Pfeiffer/Campbell were also named to the All-Conference team. Also garnering conference honors were Campbell, Hewitt, Pfeiffer and Brittain as they were named to the Great South Athletic Conference All-Academic team.

The 2006 season will feature eight home matches with crucial Atlantic-South Region road trips to Salisbury, MD and Sewanee, TN and will be capped off at the Great South Athletic Conference tournament to be held in Maryville, TN.

Coaching Staff



Shane Wood, Head Coach

Shane Wood is entering his sixth year as the head coach of both the Piedmont College men's and women's tennis programs.

After a successful playing career at Piedmont in 1993 and 1994, Wood was named head tennis coach for their dormant men's and women's teams in 1999. He has immediately produced positive results, recording a 113-91 overall record for both teams in his six years as head coach.

During his tenure, Wood was named GSAC Men's Coach of the Year in 2001-2002, 2002-2003, 2003-2004 and 2004-2005. He was named GSAC Women's Coach of the Year in 2003-2004.

Wood's most prominent highlight as coach came during the 2003-2004 season when his men's team was ranked as high as 23rd nationally in NCAA Division-III and earned the school's first-ever berth in the Division-III National Tournament.

Wood also coached participants in the Division-III men's singles championship in

2004 and 2005 and men's doubles championship in 2005. In addition, Wood's players earned Intercollegiate Tennis Association (ITA) All-America honors in singles in 2003-2004 and 2004-2005. The National Christian College Athletic Association (NCCAA) also awarded Piedmont players with first-team All-America accolades in singles and doubles in 2001-2002 and 2002-2003.

During his tenure, the men's team won the GSAC championship five times, while the women's teams completed two championship runs. Wood was also a member of the Atlantic-South Regional Advisory Committee for NCAA Division-III men's tennis.

Wood earned his bachelor's degree in History from the University of Georgia in 1998 and went to complete his master's degree in Public Administration from Piedmont in 2004. He has been a member of the United States Professional Tennis Association since 2001 and achieved P-2 certification in 2005.

Wood and his wife Jennifer have two children, Payton and Abby.

Nick Nash & Sebastian Stanescu Assistant Coaches

Sebastian Stanescu and Nick Nash will be entering their first seasons on Coach Shane Wood's staff.

Both 2005 graduates played an instrumental part in the 2005 Piedmont College men's tennis team who finished the season ranked eighth in the Atlantic-South Region. The doubles team of Stanescu and current senior Valentin Sigartau finished the 2005 season ranked 15th nationally. Stanescu was also awarded the first-ever NCAA Post-Graduate scholarship in Piedmont College history.

Stanescu and Nash are currently pursuing advanced degrees at Piedmont College.
