COMMENCEMENT SPEAKER

Jacqueline "Jackie" Ellett, Associate Professor of Art Education at Piedmont College, is the 2020 recipient of the Vulcan Materials Company Teaching Excellence Award for her dedication and commitment to teaching as well as to campus leadership. Ellett earned her Bachelor of Science degree in Art Education (1986), Master of Art Education (1991), Education Specialist degree in Art Education (2000) along with a Gifted Endorsement (2000), PhD in Art Education (2011), and her Interdisciplinary Qualitative Studies Certificate all from the University of Georgia. In 2003 Ellett became certified as a Teacher Support Specialist (TSS) through Georgia Pioneer RESA. Ellett taught in Gwinnett County for 32 years and was the elementary lead art teacher. Ellett has been involved in writing curriculum, textbooks, and standards at both the state and national levels. Since 1986, Ellett has been an active member serving on the boards of the Georgia Art Education Association (GAEA) and the National Art Education Association (NAEA 1988-1994). Ellett has also been recognized for her teaching earning numerous awards, including the 2012 Southeastern Art Educator of the Year, 2011 Georgia Art Educator of the Year, and the 1995 National Elementary Art Educator of the Year.

COMMENCEMENT

When Piedmont was founded in 1897, commencement was a five-day affair filled with speeches, sermons, academic and debating competition, dinners, and—finally—the conferral of degrees. Over the years, the time allotted for commencement has been shortened, a reflection of the quickened pace of the modern era. But Piedmont still retains many customs and traditions in its graduation ceremony that date back to the 12th century. These include the use of the mace, gonfalons and academic garb.

MACE

The Piedmont mace was handcrafted by Dr. Patrick Taylor, former chair of the Department of Art. The staff is American cherry with a leather handle, and the base was cast in bronze. The pommel, located at the bottom of the staff, functions as the symbolic foundation of the College and is inscribed with the date 1897.

The crown on top of the mace is a globe representing the College's commitment to the preparation of students for work and service around the world. Official College seals are located on all four sides of the crown. The mace and attached seals represent the authority of Piedmont College to award academic degrees as prescribed by the institution's charter from the State of Georgia.

The flame of learning is mounted on the very top of the mace. It was cast in an alloy of bronze, sterling silver and gold to symbolize the many talents and academic achievements that the Piedmont College faculty and staff contribute to the acquisition and dissemination of knowledge. The tip of the flame forms an open hand to symbolize the spiritual and intellectual development in the service to humankind.

GONFALON

Another Medieval trapping that is still part of the modern educational tradition is the gonfalon, a type of banner. The gonfalon is a standard, and in Italian the "gonfalonier" is the "standard bearer." Gonfalons are attached to a cross-bar rather than being directly fastened to a pole. Piedmont uses a ceremonial gonfalon that bears the College seal and is used at the head of the processional column.

ACADEMIC DRESS

The origins of academic dress go back to the founding of European universities in the 12th century. All Medieval students were clerks (clerici) and wore the dress of the secular clergy. The oldest articles of academic wear were the robe (roba), a loose gown, over which was worn the habit (cappa), usually a kind of tunic with short, wide sleeves. The Medieval hood (caputium) could be gathered around the neck or pulled up on the head as a turban. There were three kinds of caps: The round pileus, reserved for doctoral dignity; the tena, a round cap with strings that were tied under the chin, worn by jurists; and the square birretium. At Oxford in 1565, the square cap became obligatory, but the faculties adopted the tudor bonnet. This bonnet is still worn by doctors of law, medicine and music.

The basic design of academic costumes in the U.S. was established in 1895 and was first used at Piedmont by the class of 1902. There are three types of gowns, three styles of hoods, and two kinds of cap tassels included in American academic costume. The bachelor's gown has long, pointed, open sleeves. The master's gown is similar, but has even longer sleeves, which are closed at the bottom. The doctor's gown has full-length lapels of velvet and bell-shaped sleeves with three horizontal velvet bars. Tassels for bachelors and masters are black. The tassels for doctors are gold. The color of gowns and caps is usually black, although some schools have specified that their doctors may wear gowns of distinctive colors.

The hood varies for the respective degrees, with the doctor's hood being longer and fuller in shape than the others. The major field of study can be determined from the velvet facing on the hood. White represents the arts; gold-yellow, science; drab, business administration; lemon, librarianship; scarlet, theology; brown, fine arts; light blue, education; pink, music; and dark blue, philosophy. The hood is lined in silk in the colors of the institution that granted the degree.

Piedmont faculty have earned degrees at a number of graduate institutions, and most wear the doctor's hood.
