Piedmont University Transfer Policy

- > Courses are only accepted from regionally accredited institutions.
- > Only grades of "C" or higher will be accepted as transfer credit for undergraduate students.
- > Remedial, Developmental, Student Assembly, and Orientation courses will not be accepted as transfer credit.
- Courses transferred will not be calculated into a student's Piedmont University GPA.
- Half of all courses in the major and minor must be taken at Piedmont University.
- Undergraduate students must earn at least 30 hours of credit at Piedmont University in order to graduate.
- Transfer credit in a student's major field may be accepted provided that the courses are the same level as the corresponding courses at Piedmont University. Please consult the Registrar if you have questions.
- > Students may be asked to submit a copy of course descriptions in order to evaluate transfer hours and/or credits.
- Not all credit accepted by Piedmont University may be applicable to a student's program of study. Please refer to the Piedmont University Catalog for program requirements.
- > Graduate credit is only valid for six years beyond the date of completion.
- > Graduate students may transfer no more than six hours of credit.
- Graduate transfer credit must be appropriate to candidate's planned program and carry a grade of "B" or better.
- > Graduate transfer credit must have approval of Department Chair or Dean.
- > The number of credit hours accepted by Piedmont University will be considered in determining Satisfactory Academic Progress for Financial Aid.
